

- ▶ 155 APPROVED PROJECTS FROM 2010 TO 2018 VALUED AT \$56.7bn
- ▶ SINCE PRES. DUTERTE TOOK OFFICE IN JUNE 2016 TO FEBRUARY 2018 - 40 APPROVED PROJECTS WITH A VALUE OF \$24.3bn

UNDER PRES. DUTERTE ADMINISTRATION

- ▶ EMPHASIS ON OFFICIAL DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE (ODA) FOR MAJOR PROJECTS.

INFRA SPENDING

- ▶ 2017 TO 2022 GDP INCREASE FROM 5.4% TO 7.3%
- ▶ \$ 158 bn EARMARKED FOR INFRA SPENDING
- ▶ ECONOMIC GROWTH TO 7-8% STARTING IN 2018

- ▶ UNDER BBB PROGRAM
 - ▶ 75 FLAGSHIP PROJECTS HAVE BEEN IDENTIFIED INCLUDING SIX AIRPORTS
12 RAIL AND URBAN PROJECTS AND FOUR WATER TRANSPORT PROJECTS.
 - ▶ CONSTRUCTION OF COAL FIRED POWER PLANS.

EASING TRAFFIC

- ▶ DPWH ALLOCATED A BUDGET \$12.9 bn OF WHICH \$12.1bn EARMARKED FOR VARIOUS INFRA PROJECTS ACROSS THE COUNTRY.
- ▶ FOUR PRIORITY PROJECTS NAMELY
 - ▶ TRAFFIC DECONGESTION PROGRAMME
 - ▶ INTEGRATED TRANSPORT SYSTEM
 - ▶ RURAL ROAD DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME
 - ▶ ESTABLISHMENT OF SUSTAINABLE AND RESILIENT COMMUNITIES.



FOREIGN INVESTMENT

- ▶ PRESIDENT DUTERTE ISSUED EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 65, DATED OCTOBER 29, 2018, PROMULGATING THE 11TH REGULAR FOREIGN INVESTMENT NEGATIVE LIST (RFINL)
- ▶ TO EASE RESTRICTION ON CERTAIN INVESTMENT WITH THAT AREAS LIMITED FOREIGN PARTICIPATION.
- ▶ WILL HELP RAISE THE COUNTRY'S COMPETITIVENESS, AND ALLOW US TO BE CLOSER TO PARITY WITH OTHER ASEAN MEMBER-STATES BY OPENING UP MORE AREAS FOR FOREIGN INVESTMENT IN THE COUNTRY.
 - ▶ E. O. NO. 65 ALLOWS UP TO 40 PERCENT (FROM 25%) FOREIGN PARTICIPATION IN CONTRACTS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION AND REPAIR OF LOCALLY-FUNDED PUBLIC WORKS.

RAIL AND AIR

INVESTMENT ACROSS THE AVIATION AND RAIL WAY NETWORK

- ▶ NEW LIGHT RAIL LINES IN METRO MANILA THE FIRST UNDERGROUND PUBLIC TRASPORT SYSTEM IN THE CAPITAL.
- ▶ EXPANSION OF NINOY AQUINO INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT AND CLARK INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

According to Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA)

- ▶ Around 80% of Metro Manila residents use Public Transport daily basis.
- ▶ 9 % use Rail Transit System
- ▶ 71 % use Bus or Jeepney
- ▶ Lost Productivity per day in Metro Manila due to Traffic situation \$ 69.1m
- ▶ Increasing of Local Private Companies have begun to offer helicopter rental and ride sharing services.

ROADS:

- ▶ PAVE ROAD AVERAGE INCREASED 4% RATE ANNUALLY FROM 2007 TO 2017
- ▶ FINAL QUARTER OF 2017, 94.4% OF NATIONAL ROAD WERE PAVED.
- ▶ THIS WAS ACHIEVED THROUGH A 10,029 KM EXPANSION IN PAVED ROADS AND A 6,531 – KM DERCREASED IN UNPAVED ROADS.
- ▶ TOTAL OF 32,828 KM OF ROAD ACROSS THE COUNTRY IN 2017
- ▶ 64.4% OF 21,181 KM OF NETWORK WAS MADE CONCRETE
- ▶ 30% OR 9,854 KM WAS SURFACED WITH ASPHALT
- ▶ 5.4% (1179KM) WITH GRAVEL
- ▶ 0.2% (53.7KM) WITH EARTH.

PAVED ROAD PERCENTAGE:

- ▶ MINDANAO HAD SMALLEST PERCENTAGE OF PAVE ROADS AT 88.9%
- ▶ LUZON 94.9%
- ▶ VISAYAS 99.2%


PORTS:

- ▶ PORT OF MANILA RANKED 32ND IN THE LLOYD'S LIST TOP -100 PORTS RANKING 2017
- ▶ LARGEST IN REVENUE AND IN THROUGH PUT IN THE PHILIPPINES.
- ▶ MANAGE TO OUTPLACE NUMBER OF LEADING INTERNATIONAL PORTS IN TERMS OF CONTAINER VOLUME, INCLUDING LONDON, MELBOURNE, PIAREAS, VANCOUVER AND SETTLE, IN LLOYD'S LIST TOP 100 PORT RANK OF 2017.
